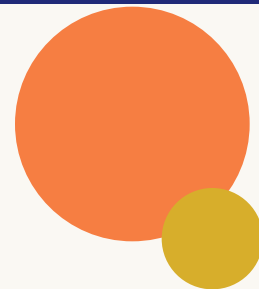

The Journey Ahead

The B’nei Mitzvah Seminar brings students together for a shared year of Jewish learning, spiritual exploration, practical skills, and community. Across eleven gatherings, students will learn with trusted teachers, practice rituals they can carry into adulthood, build friendships, and reflect on what it means to inherit—and help shape—the Jewish story.

LEARN

Big Jewish ideas

Eight interconnected Tell Institute lessons invite students to examine Jewish peoplehood, history, difference, resilience, Zionism, and contemporary life.

PRACTICE

Jewish skills

Students gain hands-on experience with ritual objects, prayer leadership, sacred time, tefillin, and preparing words of Torah.

BELONG

Cohort & spirit

Meals, singing, homes, holiday gatherings, chesed, prayer, art, and closing circles turn a class into a community.

WHO PARTICIPATES?

Students participate in the B’nei Mitzvah Seminar during the Jewish calendar year immediately preceding the Jewish calendar year in which their B’nei Mitzvah will take place. Each annual cohort includes all students whose Bar or Bat Mitzvah falls within the following Jewish calendar year, approximately September through September.
